engaging community members and all other relevant stakeholders in each phase of the project

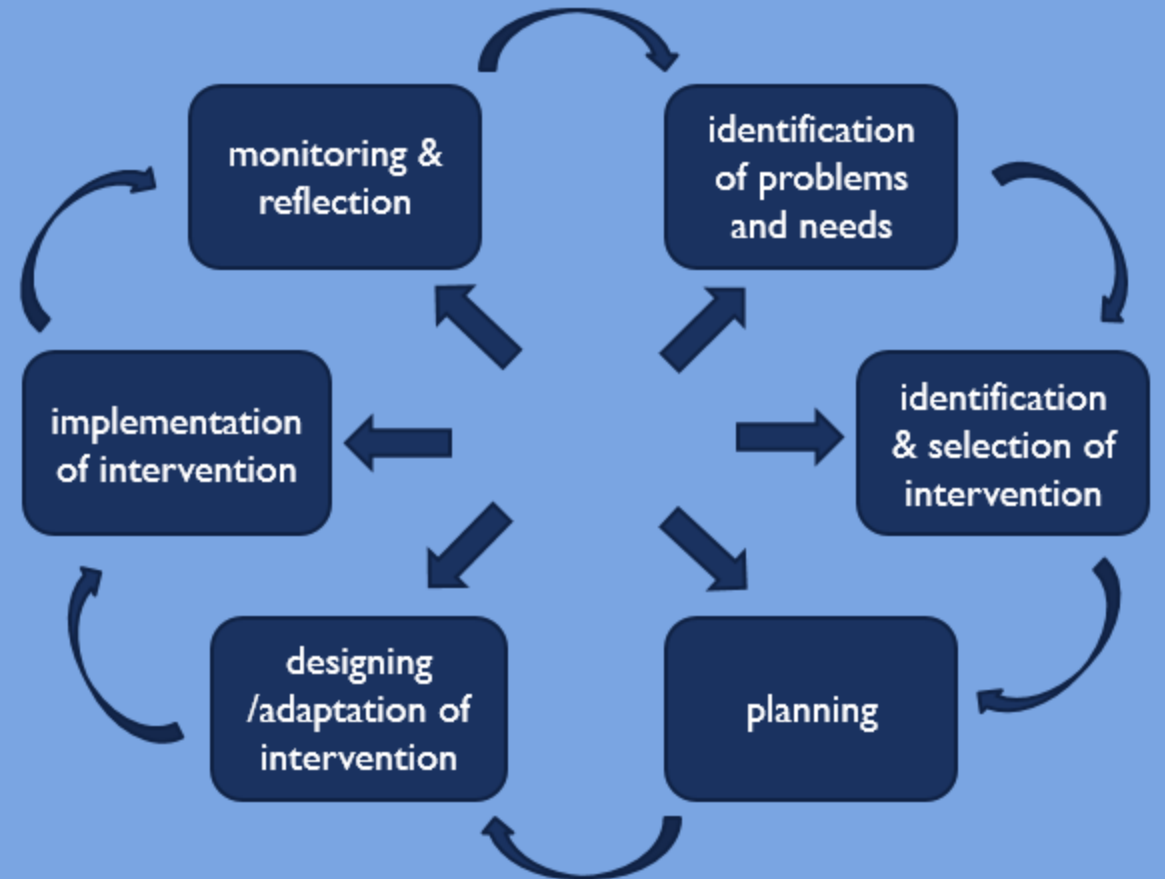


move them from the periphery to the center of the production of knowledge, designing the intervention and evaluation
